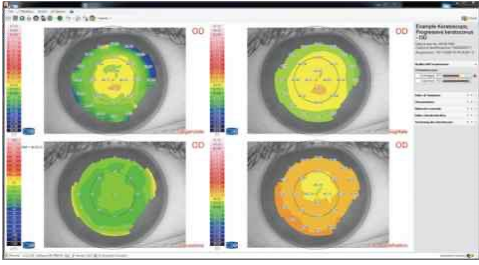

Are there plenty of contact lens options?

The options for contact lens wear have never been greater, encompassing all prescriptions and modes of wear.

'Day Lenses' worn during day include:

- Daily disposable soft lenses
- Monthly replacement lenses
- Varifocal lenses
- Lenses for astigmatism
- Lenses for dry eyes
- Lenses to enhance defective colour vision

'Night Lenses' a treatment while asleep can mean excellent vision during the day without spectacles or contact lenses!

With all these options is the ability to wear lenses from one day (or part of a day) a week to seven days a week all day (or just at night!)

Past contact lens wear not successful? – The very people we like to help!

Most unsuccessful cases of contact lens wear, involving reduced/variable vision or lens discomfort, is due to problems with how the lens and eye surface work together, not the lens itself.

There may be an insufficiency of quantity of tears, a reduction in the quality of tears or a combination of both. Recent research has shown the quality of tears to be the most common factor.

Optional in-practice treatments available to reactivate tear- producing glands can help successful lens wear

- Health and medication history
- Past contact lens wear history & symptoms
- Tear quantity/quality assessments
- Microscope examination of the front of the eye
- Microscope examination of eye lids.
- Computerised mapping of the eye surface (including keratoconus screening)
- Meibomian gland imaging
